A whale of an opera — under the water

European arts patrons are being treated to the most unusual swimming pool experience of all – an underwater opera.

taged inside Berlin's Stadtbad Neuköllnone – one of the most beautiful art nouveau swimming pools in Europe – the AquAria Palaoa is an underwater opera which allows patrons to listen to the songs of the Weddell seals under the Antarctic ice shelf as a musical message from an inhospitable environment.

It is a love song between humans and whales – a submarine acoustic event brought to the surface by an amphibian choir, a singer under water, soloists and instruments.

Palaoa is the Hawaian word for whale. The Palaoa Arctic Station is situated 15km away from the Neumayer Base in the Arctic Ocean. The recorded sounds are compressed and transmitted in real time via wireless LAN signal to Neumayer Station. After further compression the data is then forwarded to the Alfred-Wegener-Institute for Polar and Marine Research in Bremerhaven where it is made available online.

Currently Claudia Herr and the team are developing a new version of the underwater opera for other bigger swimming pools and open air/water locations. They are interested in bringing it to Australia, and Claudia encourages potential venues to get in contact with her at info@claudiaherr.de.







Investigation to determine cause of Adelaide's chlorine leak

THREE staff members have been released from hospital following respiratory complaints after a chlorine leak at Adelaide's new South Australian Aquatic & Leisure Centre (SAALC) at Oaklands Park in November.

The three staff members were in the chlorine storage area when the leak caused them to suffer respiratory prob-

lems from the fumes. They were rushed to a nearby medical centre, and the pool was evacuated and closed while the fire brigade, ambulances and other emergency services were called.

Shortly after, the staff members were released from hospital. No-one was seriously hurt and the centre went back to normal operation shortly afterwards. Some media reports suggested a faulty flange could be to blame, but the centre spokesperson said an investigation is underway to determine the exact cause of the leak.

"There was a chemical leak during the changeover process; a process that has been carried out many times," she said. "There is an investigation underway to discover why it happened on this occasion."
